


Chairman's message


Ongoing Maintenance

Members of the Oshwal community inclusive of the young and old, male and female, participated with full vigor and enthusiasm in the *Paryushan Parva* which takes place every year in the favorable month referred to as '*Bhadrapad*'.

On the first day, 29 August 2016, the members of the community were given a lecture on 'Manushya bhav nee durlabhtaa nee' by Avin K. Shah and Mehul J. Shah, from Alert Young Group of India.

This marked the start of a week full of festivities and rituals that united the community and enhanced the spirit of forgiveness and soul cleansing. The other lecture topics covered were Musical Housie with Stavans, The Life sketch of Shree Parshwanaath Bhagwaan, Shree Neminath and Shree Rishabdev Bhagwaan,

Quiz Night and The Life Sketch of Shree Munisuvrat Swami.

Essentially, the festival lasted for nine days and the first seven days prepared the members for the last day which focused on a meditation session called Samvatsari Pratikramana after which asked forgiveness is saying Micchami Dukkadam to others, which means, "If I have offended you in any way, knowingly or unknowingly, in thought, word or action, then I seek your forgiveness. Paryushan being a festival of forgiveness, members fold their hands to offer forgiveness and accept the same from others." Avin K. Shah said.
