On 26th February 2017, The Visa Oshwal Community, Oshwal Youth League and the Oshwal Education and Relief Board undertook a noble action to give Famine relief supplies to over 5500 Families in Mwingi, Kitui. The event was coordinated by the VOC Management committee members Mr Kiran Ratilal Shah, Mr Nitin Mansukhlal Shah and Mrs Nimita Vinay Shah.

A convoy of 7 lorries carrying packages of food and 2 buses with 80 Volunteers left Oshwal Centre at 7.00 am and made its way to Mwingi where the rains have failed and farms are lying barren due to the lack of water.

The people of Mwingi some of whom often only eat every alternate day gave a rousing - welcome and were highly appreciative of the gesture from the Oshwal Community.

The day was an eye opener to all the volunteers present of the level of suffering many people in our country are going through due to the drought conditions and a true reflection of what the spirit of Jainism is all about – helping, assisting and caring about all human beings around us. The Visa Oshwal Community would like to thank Mr Kiran Ratilal Shah who humbly provided all the logistics to take the food to Mwingi at no cost, OERB for the buses, Ritaben Shah who prepared the food for volunteers without charge and off course all the volunteers, well wishers and donors who made the exercise successful.

Shree Munisuvrat Swami Jinalay refurbishment

In Jainism, the presence of the image of the Tirthankars provides mental peace and harmony and encourages one to detach his or herself from the worldly desires. Thus the need to do Jin Pooja which is a ritual designed for shravaks. It has been over eight years since the idols in our derasar have been given a face lift. The idols are made of marble. While marble is often perceived as hard and durable, the same properties that make it attractive can also contribute to its vulnerability. When marble comes in contact with moisture, pyrites are formed. Pyrites are small crystals of iron sulphide which look like small black spots -

which create an impurity within the marble. In moist conditions they can corrode and cause small orange, brown or pinkish areas of iron staining. Stain removal without risking damage to the marble surface require skill and experience, thus we sought the services of Mr. Dilipbhai Patel of Arihant Art who specializes in the oop.


Dilipbhai carried out the oop on the pratimajis as follows:
The idols were washed with Aritha water

Thereafter the idols were polished by Samudra Fin (a stone resembling a stalactite) in a very delicate way so as not to graze the idols

- Then, kubri was applied
- The idols were wrapped in
 - a thick cloth with Kunja powder.
- □ Final finishing was done

In addition, all the idols had undergone replacement of Tilak, Bramar and chakshu (eyes) and beautification was done

Even the exterior idols underwent beautification and the features are now more prominent and these can be seen clearly when one does the pradikshina.





The halls at Oshwal Centre have always had a problem with sound and acoustics especially during functions where music is key. At long last we have finally started to improve the acoustics in the hall and it is expected that once complete the echo factor in the hall will be reduced and one will have a better acoustic experience.




